#### City Administrator Report

Aldermen Jim Ashley-The concrete in front of the square restrooms needs repaired. Alderman Ashley counted thirteen headstones broken or knocked at the Cemetery.

### Mayor Report

Mayor Alicia Hagen-Division Street has a big split in the road that needs filled. Members Only Band will be at the Owen Theatre November 5<sup>th</sup>, can the city restrooms be opened for the event.
