City Administrator Report

City Administrator Hillary Elliott let the Aldermen know Ozark Applicators fixed the water tower leak today. It was a small leak. The mini excavator, 2015 Chevrolet and 2017 Chevrolet have been advertised for sealed bids. The South Shop fence is being installed today and will be completed on Monday. The street department will be working overnight sometime to stripe the square.

Aldermen's Report

Aldermen Dan Wehmer-The pictures of the President and Governor in the Board room will need replaced soon. Alderman Wehmer noted the pictures will always be changing and would like to not replace them and remove them from the wall. Alderwoman Nadine Crisp received a complaint about an old RV across from the back of the Seymour Tire. The weeds along the railroad track are tall. Mitch will call BNSF. Alderwoman Crisp received complaints of vehicles parked on the side of the road on Frances. Alderwoman Crisp asked where the city limits ended on highway 60. Chief Pogue answered 60 & Killdeer. Alderwoman Crisp asked Supervisor Mitch Plummer when he thought the city would get the AMI water meters. Supervisor Plummer said the water meters are 90% installed. We are waiting on modulars to finish. Alderwoman Crisp received a text that the Library was locked one day. Administrator Elliott said the library director has been sick.

Mayor Report

Mayor Alicia Hagen mentioned school is getting ready to start. People have been asking if anything will be done for the drop off and pick up on Center Avenue. Chief Pogue has discussed different options with Superintendent Steve Richards. There is not a good solution. Chief Pogue recommends avoiding the area during this time. There has been a lot of vandalism at the parks. Mayor Hagen mentioned cameras or game cameras as a solution.
